

Name of Liturgy Leader		
Date of Liturgy and theme		Who do you say that I am?
Focus	Examples: Candle, Prayer Focus, open Bible- Perhaps use image of Jesus with the words - Who do you say I am?	
Gathering	<i>How are we prayerfully going to begin our prayer time? Light a candle, play some music, invite students to bless themselves with holy water</i>	
Introduction	<i>Our Gospel today reveals the faith of St peter and the other disciples. For the first time, when asked by Jesus who they think He is- Peter responds by saying 'You are the Messiah!'</i>  <i>Today, Jesus asks us the same question? Who is Jesus to us? What impact does a belief in Him have on our daily lives?</i>	
The Word (Scripture or reflection)	Gospel (Mark)  Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi; and on the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" And they answered him, "John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets." He asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Messiah." And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him.  The Gospel of the Lord Praise to You, Lord Jesus Christ.	Maybe use a piece of artwork as a focus:
